F — Italy has hundreds of grape varieties that are planted throughout the country. Hidden in the **Campania region** in the south of Italy, we find the little gem Fiano. Rarely seen outside of Italy, it is making a name for itself in McLaren Vale in Australia. **Mandrarossa Fiano** is a tasty wine that is an alternative to a Sauvignon or Riesling it has lovely floral notes and hints of pear and quince and fresh herbs, it is fresh with crisp acidity. An extremely versatile food wine which pairs well with shellfish, fish, chicken, pork, tomato-based dishes and charcuterie.
